



Alfa Romeo and Wolseley

I felt I had to put pen to paper regarding the article "The joy of motoring" and the ex-Gordon Fysh RLS Alfa Romeo.

It was rather sad to be reunited with this car about five years ago when I saw it in a neglected state, encased in a humidifier at the QVMAG. This is an essential car in Australia's motoring history, yet the brakes have seized solid, and the engine needs work, and I seriously believe it will never run again. I think some bits have disappeared, also.



If this car had been sold to the Alfa Romeo Museum in Italy (who were interested in purchasing but so-called "Culture Heritage" dictated otherwise), it would have been rebuilt and used as it was designed. It is one of perhaps three or four left in the world.

As a youngster, I had numerous rides in this car at Vintage Sports Car Club events and Vintage Driver's Club events, as my parents were good friends of the owner then.

I can understand that many museums rely on government grants and donations to survive, but it is blasphemy to let such an icon as this with a vast history rot away.

While on the subject, the other car that leaves me absolutely speechless is the Wolseley that sits amongst the bird shit at Woolmers Estate. This is an important Tasmanian car, yet no one would think so.

I went there once or twice when Ashley Monks was servicing it. That must have been five or six years ago. We were both saddened by the lack of interest in this car and the others scattered around the property. A car like that should be used or at least given to someone who appreciates it and will look after it. It's part of Tasmanian history, yet you wouldn't think so.

Temora Aviation Museum

The Temora Aviation Museum was one of the stops whilst I was on the National Wolseley rally.

Temora was once the location for a training school for new pilots, established during World War 2, where over 10000 personnel were involved in the school's operation and pilots were trained on the de Havilland Tiger Moth. The school ran for five years and ceased 6 months after World War two finished. The airstrip was used after this for many activities, such as parachuting, aerobatics, model aircraft etc. Temora was an ideal location due to its great weather, terrain as it was flat, and uncontrolled air space under 20000 feet.

The museum was created in 1999 by David Lowy. He is well known for his part in the Westfield corporation empire. He expressed interest in establishing an aviation museum dedicated to pilots and aircraft who had defended Australia over the years. It has two big sheds, large enough to store many aircraft, engines, pictures, history and memorabilia.

The Royal Australian Air Force, (RAAF) have an allegiance to the site, and currently own many of the aircraft, which makes a partnership between the pair, invaluable and will mean that the site continues for many years to come.




