All NRVVCC members should familiarise themselves with the NSW RMS rules and Club Bylaws dealing with the use of your vehicles on Conditional registration, together with the requirement to carry certain documents in the vehicle whenever it is being used. This concession has strict limited use.

Vehicles can only be used for outings organised by the NRVVCC and on limited testing and maintenance. Vehicles may also be used for other outings or events provided it is entered in the log book. The logbook allows a maximum of 60 days during a registration year for personal use of the vehicle in addition to events organised by the NRVVCC. For these personal use outings no notification to the club secretary is required, but all movements need to be in the log book. If you are using your vehicle for a formal or wedding, fill in your logbook, do not accept any remuneration whatsoever.

Members need to be familiar with the RMS logbook usage requirements when using the log book scheme. NRVVCC Bylaws require members with vehicles conditionally registered and sponsored by the NRVVCC are to attend at least **three Club outings** during a calendar year. Failure to meet this requirement without good cause, may jeopardise the renewal of registration for the following year.

As a Club approved by the NSW RMS, the NRVVCC is obliged to self regulate the RMS requirements to retain its approval status and so preserve the worthwhile benefits and concessions for its members under this scheme.

Dinner tonight was at Anna's Restaurant.
































#### More of Day 3 at Stanthorpe.

On Saturday after attending the Stanthorpe swap meet, we had some free time to investigate more on what Stanthorpe had on offer. We, Graeme & Sharin Gill, decided to go for a drive to the Truffle Farm which is located at 335 Church Rd, The Summit, North of Stanthorpe. Just a bit of information to share.



The Stanthorpe location is the central training facility in the Granite Belt region for truffle detection dog training / truffle sales / truffle hunts, truffle food production and retail sales.

The rare and highly valuable French Black Perigord Truffle is often heard of in culinary circles but in commercial farming areas suddenly becomes very secretive due to security and biosecurity reasons.

The Truffle Discovery Centre unearths all that is truffles with information, products and tastings, gournet product range and interactive exhibits.

The Truffle Discovery Centre visitor experience includes:

- Viewing of our Stanthorpe Display Truffiere and tasting of truffle products.
- · Hear the story about truffle growing in Queensland and our role with the local farms.
- Interactive gallery see and smell a real truffle, taste truffle products
- Gourmet food tastings sourced from local, regional and global produce including truffle infused oils, honey, salts, mustard, mayo, aioli, salsas, butter, brie and balsamics.
- Our Granite Belt Gourmet range with tastings of our amazing jams, chutneys, relishes, sauces and balsamics.

We purchased these items which are only a sample of what they have on offer. Taste testing for most if not all items.



This is well worth a visit when you're in the area.

#### What seatbelt detection cameras mean for your vehicle

Seatbelts are recommended for all vehicles where installation is possible. If a seatbelt is available, it must be used.

Wearing a seatbelt doubles the chance of surviving a crash and reduces the risk of injury. Each year, around 29 people are killed and 76 are seriously injured on NSW roads because they were not wearing an available seatbelt.

Passengers who are in a vehicle that does not have seatbelts fitted should sit in the back seat, where possible.

Seatbelt detection cameras detect vehicles where a seatbelt is not worn properly by both drivers and passengers.

As with police detection, the driver can be fined and have demerits applied if they and/or their passengers are not wearing their seatbelt properly.

The age of the vehicle and the requirement of the vehicle to have seatbelts fitted will be considered by trained officers in determining whether to issue a fine. It is important to make sure your vehicle is compliant and has the appropriate registration.

A vehicle that does not have seatbelts installed must be compliant with the relevant legislation and/or Australian Design Rules at the time of manufacture.

Registering a classic or historic vehicle does not mean that you are automatically exempt from seatbelt compliance. Existing child car seat and seatbelt road rules continue to apply.

Seatbelt detection operates in a similar way to mobile phone detection. Cameras will capture images of passing vehicles in all traffic and weather conditions. Artificial intelligence software then automatically reviews images and detects potential offences.

The images showing likely offences go through several stages of human review before a fine is issued. NSW Police will also continue to enforce seatbelt and restraint compliance.

If you receive a fine but believe you haven't committed an offence, you can request a review by Revenue NSW. More information about requesting a review is available on the <u>Revenue NSW website</u>.

#### Classic Registration Number Plate

From 1 July 2024, a new number plate will be available for vehicles in the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). The new number plate replaces the Conditional number plate traditionally issued to vehicles in the scheme. It will be automatically issued to new CVS registrations and available to be purchased for a one-off fee for existing vehicles in the scheme at the time of registration renewal.

The new number plate size and design better fits classic vehicles, without needing alterations to the plate or the mounting. It also includes the word 'Classic' to enhance the authenticity of classic vehicles and to help differentiate classic vehicles from other vehicles.

Car plate dimensions 317mm x 134mm Motorcycle plate dimensions 186mm x 100mm

#### Frequently asked questions:

What vehicles can the new CVS number plate be issued to?

Vehicles joining the CVS and existing vehicles in the CVS can be issued with the new number plate. For existing vehicles in the CVS, the new number plate can be purchased at the time of registration renewal. The new plate will be automatically issued to vehicles joining the scheme.

 Can the new CVS plate be used on vehicles in the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS)?

No, only vehicles in the CVS can be issued with the new CVS plate.

Can I replace my existing CVS plate straight away?
 To prevent impacts to the supply chain, Service NSW can only issue the new CVS plate when establishing a new registration or at the time of registration renewal.

How much does the new CVS number plate cost?
 From 1 July 2024, the new plate is \$55. This is the same price as all General Issue number plates.

 Do I have to pay the \$55 to replace my existing Conditional number plate to the new CVS number plate?

If you want to replace your existing plate to the new plate at the time of renewal, you will need to return your existing plates, complete the Number Plates and/or Cancellation of Registration form and pay the \$55 fee for the new plate on top of your renewal fee. Alternatively, you can keep your existing conditional registration plates.

Can I personalise my new CVS number plate?

No, the new CVS plates will be issued in numerical order "off the shelf, in sequential order", with no personalised options available. Personalised plates are only available for full registration. The full range of myPlates options are available on <a href="mayblates.com.au">myplates.com.au</a>.

- Can I remake my existing number plate characters onto the new CVS plate?
   No.
- What is happening to the existing Conditional number plate?
   The existing Conditional number plate will continue to be produced and used for other vehicles in the conditional registration scheme, such as tractors


