








There's nothing new under the sun. Google Patents Sticky Car Hood to Trap Pedestrians

Google Patents Sticky Car Hood to Trap Pedestrians in a Collision The human flypaper is designed to mitigate injuries when a car, person collide.

This is an illustration from a patent application shows the operation of an adhesive that Google hopes will help mitigate injuries when a car strikes a pedestrian.

In a patent issued this week, the search giant describes a "system for protecting a colliding object from a secondary impact, after an initial impact with a vehicle."

The patent calls for a giant sticker to be placed on the front end of a vehicle, with a special coating over the layer that is only broken when something collides with the vehicle, exposing the adhesive and helping the colliding object to remain on the vehicle.

The idea is to prevent a pedestrian from being thrown after the impact and potentially sustaining even more injuries. In the event of a collision between a vehicle and a pedestrian, injury to the pedestrian is often caused not only by the initial impact of the vehicle and the pedestrian, but also by the ensuing, secondary impact between the pedestrian and the road surface or other object, Google writes in the patent.



PEOPLE CATCHERS from JJ. (and Rick.)

EVER SINCE LONDONER BRIDGET DRISCOLL became the first pedestrian to die in an automobile accident in 1896, (The death of Bridget Driscoll (c.1851 – 17 August 1896) was the first recorded case of a pedestrian killed in a collision with a motor car... You can re-read all about it in the DVHCC Newsletter, July 2023. Volume.49 No.12...ED), the authorities said, "That this must never happen again." Road deaths since have reached astonishing numbers. In the USA for example, the National Agency estimates that 40,990 people died in motor vehicle traffic crashes in 2023, a decrease of about 3.6% as compared to 42,514 fatalities reported to have occurred in 2022. Worldwide, the figure had decreased slightly to 1.19 million road deaths. (Don't ask me how many persons were injured by motor vehicles during the same time period.)

In the 1930's, one invention, aimed to solve the problem, was the 'People Catcher'. In front, or incorporated within the front bumper-bar, was a people scoop. When the driver saw an errant pedestrian, he would activate a lever, which would, in turn, deploy a large catcher. All being well, the catcher would collect the wayward pedestrian and prevent him from passing under the car.

Some trucks were also fitted with a more elaborate catcher. The deployed catcher tracked the ground on rollers with the intention of catching or deflecting the pedestrian away from the wheels.


As late as the seventies, a sloping bonnet behind a concealed bar was fitted by auto maker. The bar released after impact with the pedestrian who was expected to be caught atop the bonnet. The bar prevented him from sliding off the bonnet and so passing under the car.

(Unfortunately, I cannot find any reference to that particular article. ED.)





This Roller Safety Device Sweeps Away Fallen Pedestrian



This new safety device, consisting of a shield and roller geared to the motor, sweeps the man ahead till the truck comes to a halt.

TRUCKS equipped with the new safety device shown in the photo at the left will literally sweep a fallen pedestrian before it and thus save him from being crushed to almost certain death beneath the heavy wheels. The device consists chiefly of a grooved roller mounted on an extension arm in front of the wheels and geared to the engine.

On coming in contact with a fallen pedestrian it tends to roll him ahead till the truck can be brought to a stop. Ordinarily, it projects out in front of the car, serving as a bumper, but is released immediately by the driver when there is a possibility of an accident.

- · 1 cup all purpose flour




Preheat oven to 350




Spread batter into a 8" square pan and bake 15-20 minutes or until tester comes out clean. Cool completely and store covered.





WIRING DIAGRAM


