### This & That Continued as a tribute to Lloyd Hocking; Inaugural Member No. 2 Jason Palmer

PART 3: Whilst the "Motorcycle wars" raged on in Hamilton, towns in the surrounding district weren't going to miss out on that action. In June 1910, Alfred 'Alf' Young opened a bicycle shop in Whyte Street, Coleraine, situated on the site of what was to become Sartains Garage. Initially selling Hercules, BSA & Chater-Lea racers, built to order. It is rumoured that Alf won a large amount of money by backing a horse called Parisian and with those funds expanded his business by including a home built motorcycle named The Parisian. A variety of engines could be ordered but all other parts were manufactured in Coleraine from 1912 onwards. As well as The Parisian, Young advertised himself as local agent for Triumph, BSA, Peerless, F.N, Matchless, Precision, E.W.B & Rudge e.t.c, e.t.c. "Order through us we can advise you, teach you and thus save you worry and expense."

Young continued to offer The Parisian at least until 1919 but continued to offer Motorcycles well into the 1920's in Coleraine.

Around the same period, Albert Otto Berkfeld moved from Mt Gambier, South Australia to Casterton, around 1911 and started a bicycle shop in Henty Street. Shortly afterwards he began to assemble his own motor- cycle, The A.O.B.

Unfortunately, like many others, details of the A.O.B motorcycle are scarce. It was believed to be around 3 ½ H.P, capable of 45mph.

A.O.B later, (1916) became agents for Indian Motor-cycles and Ford cars. Like Young, it isn't known how long the A.O.B lasted in production but A.O.B Motors was still going well into the late 1920's. It is believed there are no surviving examples of either Motorcycle.

Back In Hamilton, by 1914 companies Leitch/Riley, Crean & Leslie had begun to advertise more well established makes above their own brands. D.D Riley had begun to offer Indian & Rudge Multi brands. Local early trials, especially with the Hamilton Y.M.C.A Motorcycle Club were conducted on Riley's, in 1914 D.D and C. Whitford competed in the 100 mile contest between Camperdown & Lismore (double journey) in a 3 ½ Rudge and 6h.p J.A.P respectively. Whitford retiring during the first leg and D.D finishing 4<sup>th</sup> after stopping to assist a rider after a crash.

In 1915, D.D left Hamilton on a Rudge Multi at 4.20 a.m, arriving in Melbourne at 10.20 with a 15



minute stop over in Geelong. Mr Riley reported that no trouble was experienced on the trip and the fastest speed recorded on good stretches was 50 m.p.h. In December 1915, Leitch was still advertising a new build Riley 4 ½ with 3 speeds, long exhaust complete with coach-built sidecar for 100 pound.

Leslie continues to advertise their own motorcycles, on 8 May 1915 promoting Precision Engines as having been used in our Leslie Motor-cycles during the past 7 years and recent events have proven the wisdom of our choice (maybe WW1). We have received flattering Testimony to the durability and reliability of our Leslie Motorcycles. Leslie also advertising agen-

cies for Peerless, Excelsior, Harley Davidson and Pope Motorcycles amongst others.

After continuing to build Crean motorcycles, last advertised in 1913, by 1915 Crean's had dropped its own brand and concentrated on advertising Precision Big 4's and agents for Triumph, J.A.P, Veloce, Peerless and Overseas Motors.

By late 1914, 100's of young men and potential customers had left Hamilton and surrounding districts to enlist in the services for WW1. With production moving into a war footing ordering and receiving proprietary parts would have become excessively difficult for local manufacturers. Low priced & readily available American cars had started to take over the Australian market including Dodge, Buick, Chevrolet and at that stage un-hindered by war production. In 1918 Leitch Cycle & Motor Depot had ceased to trade but D.D Riley continued a very long association with both the Motorcycle, Motor Vehicle trade & motorcycle racing.

In 1918, Leslie Cycle & Motor Depot was taken over from J.J Moloney by H.J Johansen who also took the Indian agency.


In February 1920 the business and building burnt down in what was described as a 'suspicious' fire.

Creans Cycle Deport continued on until 1919 when it reverted purely to a sports store. So ended Hamilton's manufacture/assembly of unique motorcycles. Without dedicated local historians nearly





all would have disappeared into history. Information about them is scarce to non-existent. As far as survivors I believe there is 1 Leitch, 1 Riley and no known complete or parts of Leslie, Crean, A.O.B or The Parisian. As far as Granville no-one has ever heard of one. But this is Australia and stranger things have happened. If anyone possesses other information, I would like to hear from you.
