# Signs You Should Stop Driving

On the road, little mistakes can have big consequences for you and the people around you. So, if you find yourself doing any of the following while you're driving, it might be time to consider other forms of transport:

- · Getting lost consistently
- · Colliding with or scraping against stationary objects (like a car, pole, or wall) while parking

This way, you'll have an independent opinion on your or your loved one's driving ability and receive professional advice on the next steps.

Otherwise, if it's not yet time to completely give up <u>driving</u>, you can make a few minor changes that might help minimise your risk of having an accident.

For instance, you could avoid driving in low light, or when the weather is especially bad.

Or you could limit your car use to familiar roads within a certain distance of your home.

Living life without your driver's licence might mean making a few adjustments, but it shouldn't affect your lifestyle. For example, rather than <u>driving</u> to the local supermarket or pharmacist, you could opt for home delivery. 
